When participants get to the villages they are welcomed with traditional dances, speeches, and greetings from the villagers

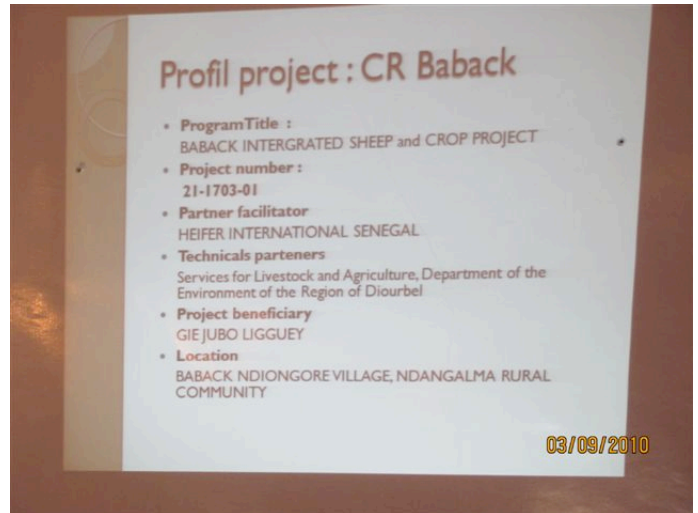


Photo of the training study tour participants get when they visit the country office. There is detailed information about each of the projects which will be visited.
